

Twitter, the most-preferred platform for world leaders

Social media platforms — and twitter in particular — are gaining importance with more world leaders and governments taking advantage of them for various purposes.

Even China, which has barred Western social media networks in that country, is now looking for its presence on these platforms.

Interestingly, three Twitter accounts from India are among the top 10 world leaders' accounts with most number of followers.

All these points are highlighted in 'Twiplomacy Study 2018' — a global study of world leaders on social media — which was conducted by the global communications agency BCW, and posted in a blogpost of Twiplomacy on Tuesday.

BCW identified 951 Twitter accounts of heads of state and government, foreign ministers and their institutions in 187 countries worldwide. The study analysed each leader's twitter profiles, tweet history and their connections with each other.

Data were collected on May 18, using BCW's proprietary tools.

@realDonaldTrump achieved 264 million interactions in 12 months till May 18; it receives an average of 20,319 retweets per tweet (Twitter interactions are the total of likes and retweets)

@NarendraModi recorded 52 million interactions

@Pontifex achieved 22.78 million interactions; the Spanish and English Papal accounts garner more than 10,000 average retweets per tweet



Obama was the first one to tweet

Former US President Barack Obama was the first world leader to set up a Twitter account, on March 5, 2007, when he was still Senator of Illinois
